Supervisor Lull called the meeting to order at 1PM and led the pledge to the flag.

Town Board to meet with the Citizen's Finance & Planning Committee and members of the Recreation Commission regarding improvements to Crellin Community Park.

Lull stated that CARP is soliciting funds for Town Park improvements. Mike West handed out a list detailing what needs to be done at the Park. Discussion ensued.

\* PS21 offered to sell their bathrooms @ \$18,000. This would eliminate the need to rent which costs \$350. /month X 5months = \$1,750.00. There are 7 stalls including one handicapped. Bob Boll can move the bathrooms for \$2,100.00 and Highway Superintendent Joe Rickert will dig the trenches Fencing, paint, landscaping and installation, \$5000.00. Total of the whole project is \$25,100.00

\* The bathrooms would be hooked into the Village sewer system. Pat Pendergrass will meet with the Village on what this is going to cost.

\*Location of the bathrooms has not yet been decided on, according to West. Lull suggested behind the basketball court between two trees.

\*As per Wapner the bathrooms will need a crushed stone foundation.

\*Relocation of Game-Time play structure (if needed) . \$4000.00 to remove and \$4000.00 to reinstall. Work to be done by Game-Time certified installers.

. \*The tennis court needs repair at a cost of \$6,200.

PUBLIC COMMENT STATEMENT

The Chatham Town Board appreciates information received from the public during the Public Comment portion of each meeting, which often is very helpful in the governance of the Town. However, tonight is not intended to be a debate with the public or a question and answer period. Supervisor Lull will bring a resolution to the Town Board for park improvements. Funds will be taken from contingency to cover the costs of the projects.
